Dear Honorable John Hill,

Government Control of Water Usage – Notification of My Will

Thank you for your prompt reply. There appears to be a misunderstanding of my request.

The Australian Constitution does not recognise political parties and ministers, nor provide for delegation of responsibility and authority, particularly from a Senator to a member of the House of Representatives. As a senator you are one of twelve representatives of the people of Victoria and to quote Sir Robert Garren from the Commentaries on the Australian Constitution “are so represented for the purpose of enabling them to maintain and protect their constitutional rights against attempted invasions, and to give them every facility for the advice of their particular and special interests.”

I require you to fulfil your sole legal duty and to honestly, impartially, and searchingly examine all matters that properly may be placed before you and, with unbiased judgement, vote according to your conscience, your sense of legal responsibility and according to the will of the people that you represent.

I repeat from my previous correspondence dated 5th February 2007. IT IS MY WILL that **you** take immediate and ongoing action to ensure that with respect to any aspects associated with the management of water and rights to use, that:

1. the rights of the people granted in the Australian Constitution section 100 are maintained;
2. the Commonwealth or States do not enact any laws with respect to water that are outside of the powers of Parliament as set out in the Australian Constitution section 51.
3. the Commonwealth not accept any control of water rights or management under the provisions the Australian Constitution section 111.
4. you determine the will of the people with respect to water conservation and put in place policies and laws that only reflect the will of the people.
5. you allow your party parliamentarian colleagues to be allowed to fulfil their judicially defined legal function and duty in their Houses of Parliament and to speak and vote absolutely freely according to their individual conscience and to reflect the will of the people they represent.

Further it is MY WILL that by prompt return correspondence you:

1. inform me of any proposal in relation to water rights that is contrary to powers and rights set out in the Australian Constitution; and
2. inform me of the results of your actions to ensure the water rights remain as set out in the Australian Constitution.

I am one of her Majesty's respectful Subjects, God Save the Queen.
